### GRASP

Dover Bay Counselling is hosting the GRASP program Do your friends come to you for advice? Are you interested in working with people? Are you a natural helper? GRASP is an interactive gatekeeper training program for students grades nine and above who are interested in learning skills to become effective Peer Helpers. Themes in the program address growth, resilience, acknowledgement, suicide awareness, prevention and planning. The program is after school for four weeks from 2:00-4:30 and begins on Feb 28. ### **RCMP Youth Camp**

Interested in policing or emergency services? Experience 5 days of police skills training at the Central Island RCMP Youth Camp. This takes place from July 8<sup>th</sup> - 12 at NDSS and is open to grade 11 and 12 students. Come by the counselling area for more information.

Chosen students will attend the camp and experience a variety of activities that a police cadet would experience but in a capsulated format. Students will receive instruction and lectures in law, police tactics, social skills, physical training, selfdefense and a variety of other topics. They will be involved in role playing scenarios where they will take on the role of a police officer. They will be required to work in a team and partake in all of the planned activities.

Meals, lodging and stationary will be supplied. A list of camp rules will be supplied to the successful candidates and any student not complying with these rules will be dismissed from the Youth Camp and sent home.

## ISLAND CONNECT-ED

As a result of the upcoming curriculum change for grade 11 and 12 courses, all Island ConnectEd grade 11 and 12 courses will end at marks cut-off in June. We want to ensure students are not surprised by this firm deadline for Grade 11 and 12 course completions. It does mean that any grade 11 or 12 courses that are not completed by marks cut-off in June will be given a final grade of "Withdrawn".

Students requiring their courses for graduation should make certain that their courses are completed on time. Any students still requiring the course may enroll in the new version of the course the following year.

Due to the firm June end date, course requests for grade 11 and 12 level courses will be closed as of March 1, 2018 (with the exception of Keyboarding 11, PE 11 and PE 12 which close on February 15, 2019). This gives students two weeks to become active in their studies prior to Spring Break. So ... If you are looking at enrolling in more grade 11 and 12 level courses, please be sure to request the course prior to March 1!

### ISLAND HEALTH MEASLES INFORMATION Information for Students and Families.

With the outbreak of measles in Vancouver, BC, families may be wondering what steps they can take to protect themselves from measles. Vaccination is the best method of protection. All school age children and adults born in 1970 or later should have 2 doses of MMR vaccine for full protection. Most people born before 1970 are immune to measles because of past exposure or disease. Please take some time to check your vaccination records to see if you or your children need additional vaccination. available from Vaccination is physicians, pharmacists (for adults and children over 5 years), and public health units (for children). Learning Services Appreciative Inquiry March 11, 2019

Dear Parents and Guardians:

Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools (NLPS) will undertake an Appreciative Inquiry of the supports it provides to students in order to determine exemplary practices, and how the district can promote these practices in Kindergarten to Grade 12.

The district is currently examining available sources of data but may engage Learning Support staff through focus groups, face-to-face meetings, and/or online surveys by asking such questions as:

How are we meeting the needs of and enriching the support of our diverse learners?

## What are the exemplary and high-impact support services across the district?

Key elements of the Appreciative Inquiry process will:

- Focus on continuous improvement for all students, including students with special needs;
- Analyze evidence about educational programs, including special education programs and services;
- Ensuring programs and services align with the NLPS Learning Framework and the Board's goals; and,
- Determine specific recommendations to address goals that may include both strategies and structures.

The Appreciative Inquiry will begin engaging staff in March and will continue until the end of April 2019. The Steering Committee will develop a draft report in June and present to the Board of Education in September.
