Traffic Safety: Student Drop Off and Pick-Up

The Dover Bay parking lots are extremely busy before and after school, and the safety of everyone is our priority. To help with this, we ask that when students are being dropped off and picked up that the proper areas are used.

Students should be dropped off and picked up in THE MAIN PARKING LOT ONLY.

To access this, enter off McGirr Road (near the McGirr Field Sport Complex) and follow the outside of the parking lot to the drop off area adjacent to the bus loop. There are then two exits: the first near the front portable, is a right turn only, and the other near the McGirr Fields is a right/left turn exit.

Please do not drive your vehicle into the entrance for the bus loop or enter the fire lane parallel to McGirr Road. We also ask that you do not park anywhere with a yellow curb
