Course Requests for 2022-2023

Good Morning,

Students will be completing their online course selections for the 2022/2023 school year starting next week from January 18 to February 16th, 2022.

Grade 8 and 9 students will complete their course selections with Mrs. Webb during their Career Education time where they will participate in a course selection presentation, view a short film on elective offerings, and enter their selections into MyEd by the February 16th deadline.

Grade 10 and 11 students will complete their course selections with a counsellor during their Career 10 or English 11 course by February 16th.

To prepare, students are encouraged to discuss and review course options with their parents/guardians found in the course selection booklet found on our [school website](#) on the counselling tab. It is essential that students make informed choices when completing their course selection. Please be sure to view the informational course selection resources prior to making course selections for next year.
